




# HMD MEMBERSHIP

It is our pleasure to announce that Missy Lankler has agreed to be our volunteer director of Seneca Schoolhouse Program. With the start of the fall schedule, Missy brings a special level of enthusiasm to the program and is looking forward to working with the executive director, Rande Davis, in restoring a day at the schoolhouse as a "right of passage" to students at Poolesville Elementary and Monocacy Elementary. Amazingly, the county determined that our program does not meet their fourth grade curriculum, and while we draw many participants from private schools and other youth groups, our own children have been missing out on this insightful, educational, and entertaining experience. We hope to reverse that situation in the near future.

We hope all members of HMD contribute by spreading the word to all their acquaintances about the success and importance of having young people learn the history of education in our area. One goal for the school is to have it open to the general public at least one day a month, if not more, as soon as possible. Of course, to do so requires volunteers willing to serve as hosts on such occasions. If this contribution is something that appeals to you please let Missy know that you are available. Ideally, we would have four such volunteers to spread the time of hosting among others to minimize the amount of time anyone would need to volunteer.

# **Update on Progress Toward HMD Goals**

**PRIORITY #1:** You may have noticed on the front page that paid membership increased by 25% from June to July. We have had as many as 250 members and our goal is to reach 300. So while the growth trend is in the right direction we have a long way to go. The fact is, we know we have far more than 300 friends of HMD in the community. The difference in being a friend and a member is very simple; a member is current on their annual dues. Every person who has voiced their support considers himself or herself a member and as someone who has been one for a long time. Yet, most really are not current "members." HMD has not had a thorough membership drive for a while, so that is understandable. Annual membership now begins the month you join or rejoin and we will be sending out dated membership cards. So you will easily know when your membership is up for renewal. All the information on membership follows at the end of this newsletter. Without members, HMD is nothing.

# PRIORITY #2: OPEN THE JOHN POOLE GENERAL STORE EVERY SATURDAY AND SUNDAY MARCH THROUGH DECEMBER.

As you may know, the John Poole House has been open most every Sunday since May. Moving toward the fall, it looks like we may be able to consider opening on Saturdays as well. We are very grateful to Karan Kalantizis and her daughter, Charlie Glass, and Willis and Carter Van deVanter, and Jennifer Moropolous who have recently offered to assist by hosting the store once a month for a two and half hour time period. We think teaming up with one other person makes the task easier and more enjoyable. No volunteer or volunteer team will be asked to host more than once per month. Additionally, all volunteers will select the date of their hosting. We can also assure volunteers, it will be more fun than they might expect. We need just four more individuals or teams for once per month to be open Saturday and Sunday. Is this something you can do? Let us know.

#### PRIORITY #3: MONTHLY CULTURAL/EDUCATIONAL EVENTS

As you know, we seek to have a cultural/education event in the Old Town Hall at least once per month. In May, while not in the Old Town Hall, we had a very successful tour of the Seneca Quarries hosted by Bob Kapsch. In June, we had a fabulous photo contest with over 80 entries focusing on the Montgomery County Ag Reserve. As previously mentioned, in July we held the tribute to the heritage of the Sugarland community. Next up, we believe will be one of the most sought after exhibits. We will feature a weekend of "Poolesville in the Civil War." Jim Poole has agreed to once again provide limited lectures on the subject and we will be announcing the specific times of those lectures later. Joining him will be Greg Shores, an expert on the subject in his own right. While we will be asking for a \$5.00 donation to attend the lectures, current members will be our guests for free. Look for more details in the coming weeks. The dates for "Poolesville in the Civil War" will be August 25 and 26.
